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Brief Report:

Introduction

On the occasion of International Biodiversity Day, a National Webinar on the theme "*Accelerating Biodiversity Action through Sustainability*" was successfully organized on 22nd May 2025 by the Departments of Zoology and Botany, in collaboration with IQAC, IIC and Sustainable Academe Sustainability Division GVSU under the guidance of Principal Dr. T. Raja Rajeswari at Sri A.S.N.M Government College (A), Palakol, W.G.Dt.

The event commenced with an inaugural address by Principal Dr. T. Raja Rajeswari, who highlighted the urgent need for conservation efforts and emphasized the importance of sustainability in preserving biodiversity. The keynote address was delivered by **Miss Nahida Sheikh**, representative of the Eco Verification Program, Palghar District, Maharashtra. Joining the webinar online, she spoke eloquently on the theme of *Harmony with Nature*, emphasizing the diversity of living organisms including plants and microorganisms, and the global condition of biodiversity, with specific references to countries such as Portugal, South Korea, and the Netherlands.

The program was honoured by the presence of several dignitaries, including Vice Principal Sri T. Krishna, IQAC Coordinator Sri K. Bhadrachalam, Head of the Zoology Department Dr. M. Ramakrishna, Head of the Botany Department Sri P. Srinivasa Rao, IIC Convener Dr. V.D.V Vijaya Lakshmi, and Computer Science Faculty Sri G. Dasarath, along with other faculty members and student participants.

The webinar provided a valuable platform for spreading awareness, promoting interdisciplinary dialogue, and encouraging sustainable actions to protect and restore biodiversity.

Key Input Points:

1. Understanding the Biodiversity Crisis

- Earth hosts nearly 8.7 million species, but 1 million are at risk of extinction.
- Causes: habitat destruction, pollution, climate change, invasive species, and overexploitation.
- Human activity has altered more than 70% of the planet's land and is the primary driver of biodiversity loss.

2. Impact on Ecosystems and Human Survival

- Biodiversity loss affects ecosystem services critical to human well-being:
 - Food security (75% of crops rely on pollinators)
 - Water purification
 - Medicine development
 - Climate regulation
 - Clean air

3. Threatened Natural Systems

- Deforestation: Over 10 million hectares of forest lost annually.
- Marine life: More than 60% of fish stocks are overexploited.
- Pollinators (bees, butterflies, birds) are in steep global decline.

4. Sustainability and Biodiversity: Inseparable Goals

- Biodiversity is a foundation of sustainability loss of species destabilizes ecosystems and weakens resilience.
- Conservation efforts must align with UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) especially SDG 13 (Climate Action), SDG 14 (Life below Water), and SDG 15 (Life on Land).

5. Call to Action: From Awareness to Advocacy

- Biodiversity is not optional it's essential for a viable planet.
- Urgent need for stronger environmental policies, legal protections, and grassroots action.
- Encourage interdisciplinary collaboration: educators, scientists, policymakers, students, and local communities.

6. Community and Youth Engagement

- Promote eco-literacy and biodiversity education in academic institutions.
- Involve students and youth in sustainable initiatives like reforestation, community gardens, waste reduction, and biodiversity monitoring.
- Leverage technology and innovation to track, report, and address biodiversity threats.

7. Global Examples and Best Practices

- Highlight successful biodiversity strategies from Portugal, South Korea, and the Netherlands as referenced in keynote speech.
- Discuss how international cooperation and local adaptation can accelerate positive outcomes.

Out Come of this Activity:

The **National Webinar on "Accelerating Action through Sustainability"** successfully brought together educators, students, environmental advocates, and policy influencers to raise awareness and foster collaborative action for biodiversity conservation and sustainable development. The following key outcomes were achieved:

1. Increased Awareness and Knowledge Sharing

Participants gained a deeper understanding of the urgent biodiversity crisis, its global and local implications, and the vital role of sustainability in reversing environmental degradation. The keynote address emphasized the interconnection between human activity and ecosystem health.

2. Promotion of Interdisciplinary Dialogue

The webinar facilitated meaningful discussions across academic disciplines, encouraging collaborative approaches among departments such as Zoology, Botany, Environmental Science, and Technology to address biodiversity challenges.

3. Emphasis on Policy Advocacy and Community Involvement

The session called for stronger environmental policies and active community engagement. Participants were encouraged to advocate for biodiversity conservation at institutional and policy levels.

4. Student and Youth Engagement

Students were inspired to take leadership in sustainability initiatives. The program highlighted youth participation as critical in shaping a greener, more resilient future through eco-friendly practices and awareness campaigns.

5. Exposure to Global Best Practices

Insights into biodiversity conditions in countries such as Portugal, South Korea, and the Netherlands offered a global perspective and encouraged the adaptation of successful strategies in local contexts.

6. Strengthened Institutional Commitment

The event reaffirmed the commitment of Shri ASNM Government Autonomous College to environmental education, sustainable development, and community-oriented action through its departments and quality assurance cells (IQAC, IIC).

Conclusion
