COURSE STRUCTURE - UG

Under the aegis of Andhra Pradesh State Council of Higher Education (APSCHE), Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) was introduced, for the under graduate programmes, i.e., BA, BCom and BSc affiliated to Adikavi Nannaya University.

- a. Consolidating the system in its true spirit by providing multiple choice in domin as well as general courses.
- b. Revising the curricular framework wherever needed.

- c. Orienting syllabus to the course outcomes as advised by UGC.
- d. Updating of syllabus to match to the present needs.
- e. Replacing papers with courses
- f. Introducing better skil oriented courses to align with the emerging and employment areas.

LMS

Learning Management System (LMS) is an important initiative of the Education Department introduced to enhance the quality of teaching and promote cooperative learning among students. As an Academic Reform under RUSA, the effort is a step towards realizing the Government's vision to transform Andhra Pradesh into a knowledge hub and empower its students with knowledge and skills. Through LMS, teachers utilize various pedagogical practices like video lessons, Power Point presentations, problem solving tasks, question banks, case studies, and projects to promote active learning in students leading to effective transfer of knowledge and skills to students in and outside the classroom. Teachers are encouraged to explore few time-tested and practical pedagogical examples implemented across the world and design pedagogical methods that suit their students to ensure good learning outcomes.

THE CURRICULAR FRAMEWORK FOR UG - ARTS: UG-SCIENCE AND UG-COMMERCE ARE.

- 1. Life Skill Courses: There will be four Life Skill Courses instead of earlier 10 foundation courses with the same hours, credits and maximum marks. The objective is to inculcate the required simple life long skills. While the course in
 - * 'Environmental Education' is continued to be mandatory, and in case of others, students can opt one out of three courses, unlike in the existing system, where no choice is being given to students.
- 2. Skill Development Courses: A new set of four Skill Development Courses will be offered with two hours of teaching per week, two credits, 50 maximum marks and only external assessment. These courses are intended to train students in broad-based multiple career oriented general skills, in Arts, Commerce and Science streams and is open to all students. A wider choice is given to students as they can choose any one course from a total of six courses (two from eachstream).

- * The preferred departments for teaching LSCs and SDCs are appended.
- * In ensuring accountability among the teachers teaching LSC and SDC courses, the workload is to be reckoned for the calculation of workload of the teachers.
- 5. **Core Courses:** Three core courses of Domain subjects will be in the first three semesters, and the fourth and fifth courses will be in the fourth semester. Two domain SECs will be in the fifth semester. There will be uniformly five Core Courses in each Domain Subject in B.A and B. Sc, and 15 in B. Com.
- 6. **Skill Enhancement Courses:** Two Skill Enhancement Courses will be offered for each domain subject, in Semester V. The two Skill Enhancement Courses of each domain subject will be linked for a wider basic and practical experience to students.

- Figures in parenthesis are hours per week of Core Courses for Science and for Arts and Commerce Courses, the hours per week for Core Courses will be five.
- SEC-1 and SEC-2 in Sem-V are C-6 and C-7 respectively.
- * Teaching of two appropriate LSCs/SDCs are to be assigned to the language departments to mitigate the workload shortage for the language subjects, as being done in respect of Foundation Courses in the previous system. The workload for teaching LSCs and SDCs by the respective language department shall be reckoned while calculating theirworkload.
- * The syllabus is revised and updated keeping the Learning Outcomes in view for ensuring higher order learning skills, a requirement in higher education. The Universities and colleges shall make certain that teaching, learning and assessment are outcome oriented.
- * In the affiliation system which imposes limitations in assessing students, the internal assessment is crucial in ensuring the right learning. Universities and colleges may strengthen the internal assessment without disturbing its flexibility.
- * Co-curricular activities play an important role in promoting experiential self-learning, Participative Learning and field-based learning in students, especially in learning higher order skills. The measurable pedagogical activities can be a small part of internal assessment.

- * The respective Boards of Studies of the affiliating universities/ autonomous colleges may modify the syllabus prepared by the subject committees as mentioned above to a limited extent, without disturbing the Frame work recommended above.
- * In view of the advantages of using ICT in teaching and learning, the universities and colleges may offer 'online courses' on extra credits. They may take into consideration the standardized online courses offered by various government/public agencies and also may design their own new online courses following due procedures.
- * Similarly, online programmes such as Webinars, with greater participation of students, may be encouraged in colleges.
- * The system of credit transfer facilitates students getting better training at appropriate places. The universities may discuss and develop a uniform system and guidelines in this regard across the state. The number of credits earned under credit transfer shall, however, be limited to a small number.
- * To ensure inculcating social responsibility and compassionate commitment among the students, the summer vacation in the intervening 1st and 2nd years of study shall be for Community Service. Detailed guidelines on the Community Service will be circulated shortly.
- * To make the students employable, an Apprenticeship / Internship / On the Job Training shall be undertaken by the students in the intervening summer vacation between the 2nd and 3rdyears.
- * During the entire 6th Semester, the student shall under go Apprenticeship /Internship / On the Job Training. This is to ensure that the students develop hands-on technical skills which will be of great help in facing the world of work.
- * APSCHE issues the guidelines for the implementation and assessment of the Apprenticeship / Internship / On the JobTraining.

PAYMENT OF FEES

Last Date for Payment of fees:

First 20 Working days after reopening of the college after (without fine) the vacation of the Terminal Holidays.

NOTE: The names of the defaulters will be removed from the rolls after the last day of the particular month. Students will have to pay the fees with fine and re-admission fee after the last day of that particular month.

FEE CONCESSION

The fees payable for the following categories of students studying in the college shall be subject to the concessions noted against them:

Students belonging to Scheduled castes and Scheduled tribes and those who are converted to any other religion from any of the scheduled castes mentioned in the Appendix 36.E.R. irrespective of the generation in which the conversion took place;

- 4. Those concession shall be withheld from a student who remains for more than one year in one and the same class provided that students who is absent from the college for the whole or part of a year on account of illness and has subsequently to remain in the same class and for the second year the student may be allowed for the fee concession in the year.
- 6. The concessions granted are liable to be withdrawn in any case of misconduct such as resorting to strikes.

COLLEGE COUNCIL:

The College Council is an advisory body to the Principal. The council consists of the Principal and all In-charges of the Departments in the college including the Physical Director and the Librarian. One of the members of the council will be elected as Secretary of the council for a period of one year to maintain the minute's book and arrange meetings.

STUDENTS UNION

The selection of the college Students union comprising, Student Chairperson, Secretary, Joint Secretary, Lady Representatives and Class Representatives are made on the basis of their passing in their previous University Examinations at a time and have secured highest marks on merit basis from all classes of all groups.

Education has two main objectives firstly to impart knowledge in different subjects and secondly to make students fit to be good citizens, in order to achieve their goal. Curricular and co-curricular activities are conducted every year for over all development of the student's personality.

RULES OF DISCIPLINE

- 1. Every student should wear clean and neat uniform.
- 2. Students are required to observe order and silence at all times in the College premises and Class rooms as well.
- 3. Students are required to keep the classrooms and premises tidy.
- 4. As an ark of culture and courtesy, students shall greet the members of the college staff at their first meeting in the day out side the classroom.
- 5. They should always address their teachers with respect.
- 6. No pupil shall be allowed to leave the class-room without the permission of the teacher or until the class is over.
- 7. Students are expected to assemble in their class rooms before the teacher arrives and while taking the attendance. A student coming into the class room after roll call may be refused admission or deprived of attendance for the period.
- 8. In case of serious indiscipline by any student the Principal before taking disciplinary action may inform the parents/guardians of the nature of the acts of indiscipline committed by their wards.
- 9. Students if they indulge in any act of serious indiscipline shall forfeit their Scholarships, Fee concessions etc. Thus, it shall not ordinarily be restored.
- 10. Students guilty of going over to other Colleges or institutions to take part in acts of indiscipline would be viewed seriously and culprits would be punished accordingly.
- 11. Student's involvement in violence to themselves or others whether direct or indirect such as hunger-strike for enforcing their will on the college or the University is a cognizable offence liable for disciplinary action.
- 12. The Principal shall have the power to inflict the following punishments in the interest of the students or the institution concerned: Fine, reducing attendance, non-issue of term certificate, suspension and expulsion.

- 13. Cycling/Bike Riding with in the college campus is strictly prohibited.
- 14. Every student should carry all the necessary text books.
- 15. Every student, to whom books or other property of the college is entrusted, shall be held responsible for their preservation in good condition and in the event of those being lost or damaged, shall be required to replace by them or repay their cost.
- 16. Any student breaking or damaging any college property shall be required to pay the cost of repair or replacement and incase of will ful damage; they shall also be punished in such a manner according to the Principal's decision.
- 17. Every student must put in at least 75 percent of attendance of the lecture classes and in the case of science subjects 90 percent of attendance of the lecture classes as well as practical classes to enable him/her to obtain a certificate of attendance. Biometric attendance is mandatory.
- 18. While attending the college or public functions, students shall conduct themselves in such a way as to bring reputation to them selves and to the institution.
- 19. All the students should stand in attention whenever the National Flag is hoisted and National Anthem is sung. It is expected that every student joins the chorus in a dignified and befitting manner whenever the National Anthem is sung.

It also encrypts student's information and awards degree certificates and there by this section is the backbone of the College.

Evaluation system

- * The institution assesses every student's performance by both Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) and End Semester Examination(ESE).
- * 75% of attendance is compulsory for all the students to appear for the End Semester Examinations.
- * The ratio of CIA and ESE is 25:75
- * The marks secured by the candidate in CIA and ESE are taken together and the candidate has to earn a minimum of 40% marks.
- * Condonation fee up to 10% may be considered by the Principal on the medical grounds or on case-to-case basis.

Functions and Responsibilities

The following work shall be attended to by the Office of the Controller of Examinations:

- * Issuing of academic calendar consists of total working days, holidays and examination schedules.
- * Preparation of detailed Semester Comprehensive Time Tables and their publication in time.
- * Scrutiny of examination application forms of candidates before the commencement of Practical/Theory examinations.
- * Preparation of the subject-wise, paper-wise and date-wise statement to print question papers with code. Question Papers to be Printed shall be 10% in excess of what is actually required in each subject.
- * The question paper packet shall indicate course, subjects, semester, date of examinations, time of examinations, and number of question papers in each packet etc.,
- * Maintenance of all records, statistics, stock registers and database of candidates are pertinent to examinations.
- * Processing and passing of Bills of remuneration for TA, DA and other Conveyance/ Allowance, and Maintenance of correspondence there on.
- * Registration, distribution and dispatching of day-to-day communications/ letters.
- * Appointment of Chief Superintendents in association with Principal for the comprehensive examinations and issue of instructions regarding the conduct of examinations.
- *Appointment of officials and other staff required for the conduct of examination
- * Announcement of selection and issue of appointment orders to the internal and external examiners, Paper setters etc.,
- * Arrangements for conducting examination, collection of answer scripts, valuation, processing and declaration of results.

- * Preservation and disposal of valued answer scripts at least for Three Years after the announcement of results.
- * Arrangement for preparation and distribution of progress cards and other certificates to the candidates.
- * Collection and maintenance of statistical data regarding the number of examinations, number of candidates registered for each examination, the number of boys, girls, regular candidates and repeaters, percentage of passes, receipts and expenditure on each category of examination etc.,
- * Preparation of rank lists and their transmission to appropriate authorities/bodies.
- * Collection of work-done statements from the Chairman, Paper setters and Examiners and forwarding them to the Finance Section for payment of remuneration.
- * Arrangement for photo-copy/re-evaluation of valued answer-booklets requested. by the candidates on prescribed application form with due fees.
- * Preparation of the lists of lapses and irregularities committed by the evaluators and others and forwarding the list to the competent authorities for consideration and necessary action.
- * Scrutinizing and passing of the bills of printing and purchase of stationery etc.
- * Assisting in constitution of committees to deal with all types of cases of misconduct/ malpractices, detected before, during and after examinations.
- * Dealing with matters of examination fees and refunds if any.
- * Announcement of results of examinations, dealing the cases of withheld results for future announcement and follow up work in case of any discrepancies.

DIGITAL LIBRARY

The N-LIST project provides access to e-resources to students, researchers and faculty from colleges and other beneficiary institutions through server(s) installed at the INFLIBNET Centre. The authorized users from colleges can now access e-resources and download articles required by them directly from the publisher's website once they are duly authenticated as authorized users through servers deployed at the INFLIBNET Centre. Every student is provided 100mbps internet service.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Through the implementation of this scheme, financial funds will be provided to all of the students who are willing to study and gain higher education but they are unable to pay their fees because of the financial burden of their family.
- * The scholarship scheme was launched by the Andhra Pradesh Government; mainly the Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh, Mr. Jagan Mohan Reddy. This scheme aims to improve the Gross Enrolment Rate (GER), provide quality higher education, ensure continuation of students in the stream of higher education, and equip the students with essential skills.
- * Scholarships to the Children of Political Sufferers: These Scholarships are awarded by the Director of Higher Education, Hyderabad to the Children of Political sufferers. The certificate regarding the nature of the punishment undergone has to be obtained from the President, Andhra Pradesh Congress Committee, Hyderabad and Dist. Collector.
- * National Loan Scholarships: These scholarships are awarded by the Director of Higher Education, Hyderabad. Those who secure 50 percent of marks on the aggregate in the qualifying examination are eligible for the above scholarships.
- * Hindi scholarships to the Non-Hindi speaking states: These school Teachers: These scholarships are awarded by the ministry of Human Resources, Govt.of india, New Delhi. Those who are admitted into degree class and secure 60% of marks in Hindi in the preceding examination and who took Hindi in the previous course under(a) part I or (b) part II are eligible.
- * Merit scholarships to the childrens of primary and secondary school Teachers: These scholarships are awarded by the Director of Higher Education, Hyderabad. The children of primary and secondary TEachers in service and securing 60% of marks on the Intermediate Examination.
- * National Merit Scholarships: These scholarships are awarded by the Government on the basis of the marks obtained at the Intermediate Examination.

- * Educational concession to the children of Ex-servicemen: These concessions are sactioned by the secretary, P.W.S.R. Fund, Hyderabad to the childrens of Ex-servicemen.
- * Scholarships for Blind Deaf and Orthopedically Handicapped: These scholarships are awarded by the Director of social Welfare, Hyderabad. (No income limt)
- * General Merit Scholarships: These scholarships are awarded to list Ist year students only. Those who secured 50% and above marks are only eligible for these scholarships.
- * Scholarships to the children of state Govt. servants who died While in service: Degree Rs.200/- p.a. No Income Limit.
- * Student's Aid Fund. Aid to poor & meritorious student will be given from this as per the rules prescribes by the college authorities.
- * Government of India Scholarships: There Scholarships are also awarded by the DSWO. Students belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes who are eligible for the above Scholarships subject to the condition that their parents annual income does not exceed Rs.1,00,000 per year.
- * State Welfare Scholarships: These Scholarships are also awarded by the DSWO to students belonging to Backward Classes, (Income limit Rs. 1,00,000/- per year).
- * Scholarships to economically poor students will be sanctione by the D.E.O. (Income limit Rs. 1,00,000/- per year).
