EXAMINATION REFORMS

• **Reforms :**

Results Declaration: The Declaration of results through our college Exam portal website.

Impact: The individual student can see his/her results by enter his/ her Hall ticket Number in the Exam portal website results page.

1. **Online Grievances:** After declaration of results, there was an online grievance google form established in the college exam portal website.

Impact: The individual student able to fill online grievances Google form if he/she noticed any discrepancy in the online result when compared to previously the student submits his grievance through paper.

2. **Result Analysis:** The Controller of Examination constitutes a committee for a detailed analysis of the results, after the publication of ESE results. The committee examines the results in the light of previous performance and provides some valuable insights into student performance and evaluation methods. The Result Analysis is compiled by the CoE and is shared with all faculty members.

Impact: Result analysis has ensured concentration on student performance and has been able to identify areas of improvement in teaching-learning methodology.

3. **Examination Calendar (EC):** The practice of preparing and adhering to an Examination Calendar was initiated. The EC is prepared in consultation with Heads of the Departments and the Vice-principal which is published in the college website and displayed in the college notice board for the benefit of the students. The Examination Department ensures a strict adherence to the calendar.

Impact: The EC has brought in transparency in the examination procedure and has ensured timely conduct of examination and publication of results.

4. **Review and Retotaling:** After the evaluation of the answer script by the evaluator, the paper is reviewed by the reviewer and the paper is then re-checked for correctness and marks are retotalled to remove errors in totaling of marks.

Impact: The procedure of retotaling of marks had led to an error free evaluation and quick publication of results. As a result of this procedure there has been a reduction in grievances and in application for re-evaluation and retotaling of marks.

5. **Fee Collection through Online :** Exam fee Collecting from SBCollect Portal.

• **Malpractice Committee:**

The college takes a serious view of the unfair methods in all the theory and practical examinations. Cases of malpractice noticed at any stage are severely punishable.

Malpractices enquiry committee is constituted to dispose the cases of malpractices. The cases booked by the vigilance squad or by the invigilator are examined by this committee.

• **Practical Exams :**

Practical exams are being conducted from the academic year 2015-16 onwards at the end of each and every sem for the science students.

- **CSP, Short-term Internship :**

- **After I Year Examinations:**

- From 2020-2021 onwards, The CSP project assessment is to be conducted for 100 marks. The number of credits assigned is 4. work after II Semester and Short-term Internship After IV Semester .

- **Semester Internship :**

- **VI semester Examinations:**

- ☉ From 2020-2021 onwards, 6 months Internship assessment for the VI Semester long apprenticeship is for 200 marks and credits assigned are 12.

- **Mentoring System :**

Every staff member will be in-charge of 25 students for mentoring purpose. Every staff member will act as student ward counselor. Student profile book is maintained in the college. To finish this task with more effectiveness the exams section submits the student ward book (printed with software features) to the Principal after declaring the semester end exams result (odd semesters and as well as even semesters)

- **Revaluation provision(Semester End exams) :**

The student may appeal to the Principal for revaluation of any paper in any subject. Revaluation notice will be displayed in the notice board and a specified time will be given to apply for the revaluation. Application along with the revaluation fee receipt shall be submitted to the Principal. Those applications are forwarded to the exams section, by finishing the minimum formalities and revaluation process will be started.

- **Instant Exam (To the outgoing batch students) :**

If any student has backlog of only one theory paper in SEM – VI (External exams) he/she is eligible to write the instant exam. If he/she completes that paper the degree will be awarded (i.e., Provisional certificate will be issued). If that student has backlogs for the remaining sems (i.e., I to V) he can apply for revaluation and if he/she is benefited through revaluation, he/she is eligible to write the instant exam.

- **Stitched Answer books :**

Stitched answer books are issuing for internal exams and practical exams and semester end exams with security features.

- **Marks memos and Provisional certificate :**

Marks memos for semester end exams, consolidate marks memo and provisional certificate are issuing with security features.

➤ Mid I Examination through three kinds of questions

- Firstly, One out of three essay type questions carrying 5 marks should be given.
- Second, Five out of seven short answer questions should be set carrying $5 \times 2 = 10$ marks with weightage and
- Third, Ten Objective Type Questions should be framed carrying $10 \times \frac{1}{2} = 5$ Marks With Weightage Comprising Multiple Choice Answers, Fill In The Blank Questions, Matching Answers Questions, Comprehension Etc.,
- The Duration of Examination is 1 hour per paper for a total of 20 marks.
- **Mid II examination is to be conducted after the completion of syllabus choosing Two kinds of question, as explained above for a total of 15 marks.**
 - SEE: Duration of time – 3 hrs. Maximum marks – 60. Minimum pass mark – 21 (i.e.,35%).
 - Practical exams: Duration of time – 3 hrs. Maximum marks – 50. Minimum pass mark – 20 (i.e.,40%).
